5. Banks/exchange rate facilities

You can exchange funds at the airport or hotel after you arrive.

6. Visa

It is your responsibility to make sure you obtain the proper travelling visas **including transit visas** for this trip, please check in advance and let us know of any issues.



7. Transport to the hotel

If arrival is *before* 6pm, you can take the train (MARTA) directly from the airport:

At the airport board the **Red Marta Line** going north towards **North Springs Station**. Get off the train at **Dunwoody Station**. The ride will take about 35 minutes. The station is located 0.3 MI/ 0.48 KM East to the Hotel.

- a. Complimentary Train Station Shuttle: runs every 10 min from 7am -7pm. Look for a large van with Crowne Plaza Hotel sign on it. If you arrive after 7pm you can call the hotel and they will come and pick you up (1-877-834-3613)/ (770-395-7700 front desk)
- b. Taxi: Fee from train Station: \$7.00 (USD)
- c. Walking: (10 min) Leaving from MARTA station turn LEFT on to Perimeter Center Blvd. At the light turn LEFT on to Hammond Dr. Cross over Ashford-Dunwoody Rd and the Crowne Plaza Ravinia will be on your left.

If arrival is *after* 6pm or you prefer taxi, taxis can be hailed at the airport. The ride will take about an hour, depending on traffic.

8. Transport cost

1) MARTA train: Costs \$3.00 (USD) per ride and a \$1.00 additional charge for the first “breeze” ticket purchased. You buy your tickets at the kiosks outside the MARTA train stations.

2) Taxi will cost approximately \$55.00 (USD) from the airport to the hotel.

9. Climate

At this time of the year, the temperature has an average low of 50°F and average high of 75° F.
